

DRIVERLESS VEHICLE BILL PA HB 2398/SB 965

The PA Conference of Teamsters is asking affiliates to contact or write your representatives and senators and tell them NO to PA HB 2398/SB 965 a bill that replaces their constituents' jobs with a computer program.

TALKING POINTS

The PA Conference of Teamsters is opposed due to these reasons:

- The Pennsylvania General Assembly is attempting to pass a bill that could eliminate nearly all jobs of those who drive a vehicle for a living.
- HB 2398 would allow for the widespread operation of automated vehicles in the state without a human safety operator, threatening jobs and public safety.
- On June 15, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) released crash data covering 10 months, uncovering nearly 400 accidents from self-driving technology, including multiple fatalities.
- Unsuspecting Pennsylvania families should not be lab rats for autonomous vehicle company's untested software.
- On top of safety concerns, the bill could destroy Pennsylvania's job market. An Oxford study has shown that 47% of US jobs are threatened by automation ²
- The bill would also allow remote operations of vehicles to be done from anywhere in the United States.
- If any vehicles are to be operated remotely in the state, that operator should be in Pennsylvania– not outsourced to California, Florida, or some other state.
- Tell your Representatives and Senators to oppose HB 2398/SB 965 to protect Pennsylvania families and workers by stopping this job-killing bill!
