



PA's Shared-Work Program May Help Unionized Workers



Pennsylvania's Shared-Work program, which is administered by the Department of Labor & Industry's Office of Unemployment Compensation, is a great tool that allows an employer to temporarily reduce the work hours of a group of employees while supplementing their lost wages with partial unemployment benefits to avert laying off employees.

Employees covered by the Shared-Work plan receive a percentage of their unemployment compensation (UC) weekly benefit amount while they work the reduced schedule, if they are otherwise eligible for UC. The program empowers employers to retain a trained and qualified workforce during periods of slowdown, and quickly ramp up operations without the expense of recruiting, hiring, and training new employees.

As a union representative, you are tasked with helping maintain a productive, stable work environment for union members. Being able to provide an employer considering a temporary employee layoff with basic information about the Shared-Work program might help your employees maintain their jobs, pay, and benefits.

The Shared-Work program features some unique requirements for employers that have a unionized workforce. The department's staff offers free training and information sessions to provide you, and your members, with vital information about the many benefits of the Shared-Work program.
