

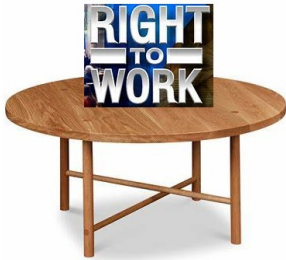

Ron DeSantis and Florida Republicans Have a plan to squeeze Public-Sector Unions

Republicans in Florida are moving ahead with legislation designed to make it harder for government employee unions to collect dues and, well, to exist at all.

The bill cleared the GOP-dominated state Senate in Tallahassee despite several Republican lawmakers joining their Democratic colleagues and voting against it.

The goal of the bill is to eliminate collective bargaining for public-sector workers who the governor doesn’t like,” said Rich Templin, director of politics and public policy at the Florida AFL-CIO labor federation. “Nobody that’s directly involved has asked for this. This is another in a very long line of policies being advanced solely for the governor’s run for the White House.”
